In Niagara and Around the World

Currently, more than 10,000 students study in 120+ programs based at specialized campuses in the Niagara region. Leveraging its expertise in program development and delivery, NC has campuses, projects and partnerships around the world, while drawing students from more than 95 countries to its Niagara-based campuses each year. In addition to its two Niagara campuses, NC operates campuses in Toronto and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

As one of Canada's leading global colleges, NC was recognized by the World Federation of Colleges and Polytechnics (WFCP) in 2024 with a silver Award in Applied Research and Innovation and, in 2022, with a bronze in Global Citizenship. NC was also recognized nationally by Colleges and Institutes Canada (CICan) in 2022 with a silver Award of Excellence in Global Engagement.

Schools of Study

The Welland Campus, set on 100 acres (404,686 square meters) of green space, is home to NC's schools of Technology, Trades, Nursing and Personal Support Work (PSW), Allied Health, Justice and Fitness and more. It houses an open-to-public dental clinic, Performance physiotherapy and occupational therapy clinic, massage clinic, the NC Teaching Hair Salon, and a hub for advanced manufacturing research.

The Daniel J. Patterson Campus in Niagara-on-the-Lake is home to NC's schools of Business and Management, Community Services, Environment and Horticulture, Hospitality and Tourism, Culinary Arts and Wine, Beer and Spirits. Unique learning enterprises on campus, include Canada's first Teaching Winery, Teaching Brewery, Teaching Distillery and Teaching Greenhouse – which are 'living labs' for students and support student learning. The campus is a hub for research with innovation centres for horticultural and environmental sciences, food and beverage, and business and commercialization. Located on the base of the Niagara Escarpment, the campus includes 15 acres (60,703 square meters) of student-restored wetlands, an apiary and more.

The following workshops will be delivered by Niagara College subject matter experts as part of the program:



Working Minds Workshop

This interactive workshop introduces students to the fundamentals of mental health and well-being, helping them understand how to recognize changes in their own and others' mental health. Through discussions, activities, and real-life scenarios, students learn practical strategies to manage stress, build resilience, and support friends in a positive way. The session also addresses mental health stigma, encouraging open conversations and creating a safe, supportive environment for all participants.

Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Workshop

This workshop aims to define and provide examples of the concepts of "equity", "diversity" and "inclusion" with the goal of promoting the full participation of all individuals in an educational environment. The workshop will also introduce the concept of "allyship" and demonstrate ways to act as an ally to individuals of underrepresented or disadvantaged groups.

Customized Seminars & Activities by Stream

In the customized seminars, students dive into hands-on activities across four exciting streams: Robotics, Automotive, Greenhouse, and Culinary. These interactive experiences challenge participants to solve real-world problems, collaborate in teams, and think creatively while exploring each field. Students will not only strengthen their problem-solving and teamwork skills but also gain practical insights, spark curiosity, and discover potential career paths in a fun, supportive environment.

MKT - Create Your Own Brand Workshop

In this session you will create a brand for yourself that will highlight your skills, passions, values and beliefs. By identifying your unique brand, you will stay true to yourself. You will identify your credentials, and purpose or why? And your greatest strengths to ensure success in business, work, and life.

Entrepreneurship Workshop

In this workshop students will explore the Entrepreneurial Journey, starting from idea generation and moving through the assessment of innovative opportunities and the feasibility of a business concept. Participants will be introduced to a variety of business models, highlighting their relevance in today's diverse business landscape. The session will emphasize how a well-structured business plan can help identify factors that impact profitability and competitive advantage. Students will receive practical guidelines and information to develop key components of a business plan, including Marketing, Sales, Customer Service, Human Resources, Legal considerations, and Financial planning.



Sustainability Workshop and Wetlands Tour

The Sustainability Workshop explores the critical need for sustainability efforts, focusing on how organizational initiatives can drive collective action through leadership. Participants will gain practical knowledge on processes for initiating change, leading to positive environmental impacts that extend beyond the local community, and support long-term global prosperity.

Leadership Workshop

This workshop is designed to present the fundamental concepts of leadership, giving participants the opportunity to reflect on the role of a leader in different professional contexts. The session will cover key notions such as leadership styles, effective communication, team motivation, and decision-making, through guided discussions and practical activities. By the end, participants will have a general understanding of the essential elements of leadership, creating a solid foundation for further skill development in future training.

Change Style Indicator Workshop

This workshop helps participants understand how they naturally respond to change by using the Change Style Indicator (CSI) assessment. Through interactive discussions and activities, students will explore three different change styles - Conservator, Pragmatist, and Originator—each with its own strengths and challenges. The session emphasizes self-awareness, communication, and teamwork, showing how different approaches to change can complement one another. By the end, participants will have a deeper understanding of their own style, learn strategies to adapt to different situations, and gain practical tools to work more effectively with others in times of change.

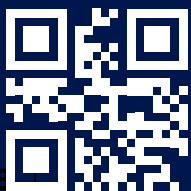
